LAUREN

JOSH

JOSH

JOSH (V.O.)

LAUREN

JOSH

(searching)

JOSH
Damn. That's crazy.
(then)
So, what brings you to this part of the country?

Josh's girlfriend returns, wrapping herself around him. She shows Lauren her engagement ring. Lauren gets uncomfortable.

LAUREN

JOSH

LAUREN
 (not meaning it)
 Nuh-uh. Nope.
 (then)
 Hey, sorry to have interrupted.
 This is obviously a special evening
 for you guys, congratulations... I
 guess I will see you in another five

JOSH
 I hope to be there. Should be fun
 to see how everyone turned out.

LAUREN
 (inside joke)
 Good luck in life.

JOSH
 (smiling)
 Yeah. You too... Send me a friend
 request if you want.

LAUREN
 I quit social media when Mark decided
 to use it as a weapon against me.

Lauren nods and takes off toward the sidewalk. Josh watches her walk away as his girlfriend gives him pecks on the cheek.

EXT. PARK - MOMENTS LATER

Lauren turns to see if he's looking. They've gone left. She takes a seat on a bench and folds up into herself.

EXT. HIGH SCHOOL ENTRANCE - NIGHT

SUPER: THE REUNION

A WOMAN(20s) sits behind a decorated table. Colorful lights blink against the backdrop.

A happy Josh strolls up to the table. He changed his hair and wears glasses. He grabs a marker and writes JOSH on a HELLO MY NAME tag.

JOSH (V.O.)
 After my marriage failed, I decided
 just to go for it. The last time we
 talked, we agreed to meet at the
 reunion. That was going to be our
 start.

WOMAN

Look at you. Welcome back.

JOSH

(looking around)

Is Lauren here?

She doesn't know what to say. Josh catches her reaction.

JOSH

What?

INT. HOSPITAL LOBBY - NIGHT

AT THE ELEVATORS

Josh frantically jams the buttons with a stuffed animal in his left hand.

INT. HOSPITAL ROOM - NIGHT

Josh stands at the foot of her hospital bed in shock. He sets the stuffed animal in a chair.

JOSH (V.O.)

I couldn't process what I was seeing... It took ten years for us to make our way to each other... For it to end this way was cruel.

Josh sits on the foot of the bed... He uncovers and wraps his hands around her feet.

JOSH

BACK TO SCENE

The song ends. Young Lauren kisses him on the cheek.

She walks off, disappearing into the darkness. Young Josh stands in place like a statue.
