I better start the turkey first it will take it longest to cook.

Molly puts the turkey in the oven and then she gets busy getting everything else ready. Someone coming through the door caught her eye, It's Mike and he is stiffing the air as he comes in.

MIKE

Good morning sis.

That coffee smells good.

MOLLY

MIKE (PAUSES)

STEVE

Molly and Susan are placing the food on the table. Steve, Matt, Mike and the kids are in the back yard playing. Frank has brought Mabel from the nursing home and they both are sitting in the living room talking. Molly goes to the back door.

MOLLY

Hey Steve it's time for dinner please get everybody to the table.

STEVE

Okay! Did everybody you hear what the lady said? It's time to eat! Hooray!

All the kids make their way through the back door and everyone else makes their way to the table. Then there comes a knock at the door, Steve gets up to answer the door. It's Herman.

HERMAN

Everyone says Amen and begin to eat.

The dinner goes well and everyone begins to get up from their chairs at the table and move to the living room.

MOLLY

Mabel looks around and a big smile comes on her face and she looks straight at Mindy.

MABEL

Do you want to hear about Keme?

MOLLY

Do you remember the story Granny?

MABEL

Oh yes and I'd love to tell it you.

There are three parts to the story and they are woven together unfolding over a period of time. The first part takes place in the early part of the 16th century in the Northeastern part of America. It begins with an Indian by the name of Keme and his name means secret thunder.

FADE OUT:

INT: KEME'S TEE-PEE- MORNING

CUT TO:

Keme with an old Indian woman, they are working diligently with Little Bird (Keme's bride). She is giving birth to their first son. She finally gives birth and they both are okay.

MABEL'S VOICE AS NARRATOR

There was some difficulty during the birth which caused Little Bird to lose quite a bit of blood much of which is on Keme's cloths.

VOICE-FADE OUT:

THE OLD WOMAN

We need some water.

KEME

I'll go to the river!

FADE OUT:

CUT TO:

EXT: OUTSIDE OF KEME'S TEE-PEE-MORNING

Keme steps outside of the tee-pee with a large smile on his face. He picks up the water pot and takes his bow and arrows as well and heads for the river. He walks down a small trail almost a mile away from the village to the river's edge. He begins to wash the blood from off his hands when something moving across the river catches his eye. It's the old grizzly bear the one called ghost bear. The old bear is huge and has been hunting Keme's people for years. The old bear has killed two young braves in the past years. The old bear turns his nose up into the air sniffing loudly and then turns in Keme's direction. He stands tall on his hind legs and steps in the midst of the river looking right at Keme, without any warning begins to charge but the river is swollen almost out of its banks from the rains that have fallen, this only slows the old bear down a little but it's just enough time for Keme to load an arrow into his bow and send off only one shot. Yes father, the old bear is finally dead.

FLYING BIRD

This is a great time for our people. We must celebrate I will talk with the chief.

That night the whole village celebrated with song and dance. The song was how the day Keme's son was born the curse of the ghost bear died. It was a good time for everyone.

FADE OUT:

EXT: THE RIVER EDGE-MORNING

CUT TO:

It's being two days since the celebrate of the death of the ghost bear when a young girl goes to the river to get some water when she is attacked by a bear, she manages to get away from the attack. This young girl is the niece of the Chief. When the chief hears of this news he calls for Flying Bird and for Keme to come to his tee-pee.

INT: INSIDE THE CHIEFS TEE-PEE-NOON

CUT TO:

CHIEF

A man that does not speak the truth is not good medicine, this man should not be allowed to live among our people, Keme must leave the village.

Flying Bird and Keme leave the Chiefs tee-pee and are walking toward Keme's tee-pee.

FLYING BIRD

I believe you son but there is nothing I can do until I can prove what you've said. Go up to the high country and take your wife and son. I can show the truth to the Chief somehow.

FADE OUT:

EXT: TRIAL IN THE MOUNTAINS-EARLY EVENING

CUT TO:

Keme and his family are moving up through a small trial into the mountains. It is raining and has been raining for several days. Keme leads his family off the main trail and onto a small trail that cuts across the ridge. He stops when he finds a place that is slightly level on the side of the ridge. It is between two ridges and Keme believes this will help shield them from the wind. He sits everything down he motions his wife to do the same. They both begin to work quickly setting up their tee-pee to get their child out of the rain.

KEME

I'll go for food.

Keme takes his bow and heads across the ridge. He quietly moves through the woods and now is about two miles away from the place he made his camp when suddenly he hears a tremendous sound coming from the direction of his camp. He runs as fast as he can to the top of the ridge that is overlooking the place where he had his family. All he sees is a river of mud and trees quickly moving down the ridge where his family once was. Keme cannot move from the place he is standing for a couple days now he finally starts to just wonder aimlessly. He is in a state of shock.

FADE OUT:

EXT: A BEACH-MORNING

CUT TO:

Keme wonders out of the woods and onto the beach his has his head hanging down and don't notice the five white men running toward him, throwing a net over his head hitting hem several times and then taking him to the ground. He has never seen white men before and does not understand anything they were saying. But he does not fight them back at all.

FIRST ENLISHMAN

Hey look; I believe this one is drunk.

SECOND ELNLISHMAN

I don't care if he is or not he's still 2 silver shekels.

They tie his hands behind him and lead him toward a small boat that is pulled upon the beach with more white men standing around the boat. He can see a larger boat out in the deeper water but still does not put up a fight.

FADE OUT:

INT: IN THE LARGE SHIP-EVENING

CUT TO:

The Englishmen have chain Keme to the wall of the boat and he notices that there are other Indians chained together as well. He knew by their cloths they were Munsee Indians from the northern tribes. During the long voyage many Indians died either from the beatings or from fever. Keme got very weak himself but as time went on he began to understand some of the words the Englishman was using when they talked with each other.

FADE OUT:

EXT: ANOTHER SHIP HEADED FOR AMERICA-MORNING

CUT TO:

We see a brief glance of the Eaton family; Fred, Mary and their son Brandon. Fred is tall and slim with red hair. His wife Mary is petite with slightly blonde hair. Brandon is dark haired boy with bright blue eyes. They are on a boat headed for America to new start a new life. They are standing on the deck of the boat looking out to the ocean.

FRED

I can't believe we're finally going to America.

MARY

I know it seems almost like a dream.

FRED

In the beginning of our journey from Deutschland, I really felt God leading us go to England. But when we arrived at England my soul still wasn't at rest, I just knew we weren't meant to stay there either.

MARY

I was glad when we left both places there were so many mean and unhappy people.

FRED

I have a dream for us to be able to worship God in freedom and truth. The bible say's that young men will dream dreams and this one is mine.

BRANDON

I've never had a dream where a person can be sea sick for so long.

MARY

Come on Brandon I'll see if I can find you something to settle your stomach.

EXT: ENGLANDS MARKET PLACE-MORNING

CUT TO:

The English men are taking all the Indians through the market place hitting them with small whips as they go, while everyone is looking on. Java is a Narraganset Indian he has managed to slip out of his chains and starts running through the market. He knocks several people down as he goes, hurting one of the old women. This action makes the crowd very angry; some of the men begin chasing him down and start hitting him, finally Keme yells out.

KEME

Stop! Please do not hurt him anymore!

The crowd stops in a silent calm. They all have surprised looks on their faces they can't believe that this savage can speak and understand their language. This gives the Englishmen from the boat time to put the chains back on Java and lead the Indians away.

KEME

You really don't need the chains, we have nowhere to go.

ENLISHMAN

I'll not take any chances until I'm paid.

FADE OUT:

INT: IN THE KINGS CASTLE-MORNING

CUT TO:

The Englishmen from the boat have requested an audience with King George to show him the Indians from the new

world. It's been a year since Keme landed in Enland he now has learned the language quiet well, well enough to communicate with those that keep him in chains. All the men are all brought into a large room that has many windows there are tapestries of men on horses and dogs chasing a fox. Keme is dressed up like his is a chief. They have put many feathers in his headband and they have painted his face. They take the Indians in before the throne where the King and his bride are seated, dressed in their finest cloths.

ENGLISHMAN

Your highness we have captured these savages from the new world to be our slaves. We desired that you may see them for yourself.

KING

Do they understand our language?

ENGLISHMAN

This one here does a little your highness.

The Englishman points toward Keme.

KING

Are you the leader of your people?

KEME

No; I am more of a medicine man to them.

KING

Do you like my kingdom and my palace?

KEME

The land is truly beautiful but the palace is too big and cold. There are so many people that live in this one place. I miss my home where the animals roam free and I miss my people.

KING

I will allow you to return to your home if you would be willing to be an interrupter between your people and mine, so we can trade goods.

KEME

Yes I will talk between our peoples.

KING

Very well take these men back to their home land. Give Keme a monthly wage for his services. Keme it has been a pleasure to meet you.

They all turn to leave the castle.

FADE OUT:

EXT: WOODS JUST OFF THE BEACH-AFTERNOON

CUT TO:

Keme is back in America and is walking into the woods with the ocean and ships behind him. He has all his gear over his shoulder and heads toward home. Several hours have passed and Keme finally comes to the place where he had left his people the last time he saw them. a puzzled look comes upon Keme's face and he talks to himself.

KEME

Something's not right here. My people would never leave these things behind.

He walks around picking up different ideas and placing them back down on the ground. He sees many burials stacks just outside of the camp site. Keme leaves the area he is looking on the trail for signs of movement on the trail. He hears someone yelling off in the distance, he runs quickly to where the voice is coming from. It's the crazy old Indian that had been driven off from their village many years ago. He lives in the caves around the mountain. When Keme comes close to his cave the old man steps out into the sun. He has old paint faded on his face with a funny smile spread across his face. The feathers in his head band are bent and some are broken, just hanging down. His hair is matted and messed up.

KEME

Do you know where the people have gone to camp?

CRAZY INDIAN

What are left of our people have moved south away from the white men. When the white men came they brought with them an evil spirit, they called it Indian fever.
Within one cycle of the moon almost everyone was dead. None of your father's medicine was strong enough, not even for your mother or himself. You will find them by the camp.

Keme slowly walks into the woods, back in the direction of the camp.

FADE OUT:

INT: MOLLY'S LIVING ROOM-NOON

CUT TO:

As everyone is sitting around they're eating nuts while listening to Mabel as she tells the story.

MABEL

It's someone else's turn to tell some of the story.

MOLLY

Yes! I believe its dad's turn.

FRANK

Unless. Maybe Herman do wants to?

HERMAN

No, Frank you go ahead. I'm not good at telling stories.

Molly notices a strange sad look on Mindy's face and so she leans in close to Mindy's face and speaks softly to her.

MOLLY

Are you okay honey?

MINDY

Yes mommy, I'm okay. It makes me sad that Keme had lost so much.

MOLLY

I know he has lost a lot. But you'll see there is a happy ending.

Mabel turns to Frank.

MABEL

Okay Frank, go ahead with your turn.

FRANK

Keme is trying to come to grips with the loose his parents. While only a few miles away the young Eaton family have started clearing their new land and building their home.

FADE OUT:

EXT: EATON'S NEW HOME PLACE-MORNING

CUT TO:

FRANK'S VOICE

Fred has made a temporary shelter built. It will be a dry place for them to store their stuff and a dry place to sleep.

VOICE FADE OUT:

They have a fire outside their shelter. Mary is cooking something to eat while Fred is sharpening his ax.

MARY

Are you two ready for supper?

Fred leans the ax against a tree and he goes to Mary and takes her hand. Brandon takes her other hand then they bow their heads.

FRED

Let us pray.

Father thank you for bring us to this new land safely. We ask you to be our strength to build our home and be our protection from the unseen things around us. In Jesus Christ name Amen.

FRED (CONTINUES)

Brandon we have a lot of work to do, so let's eat up!

MARY

I heard they hold church services at the settlements on Sunday. Do you think we may go?

FRED

We will go to see how they worship and hold their services. But if it's anything like England's messages, we will not continue to go. God has given us a bible and the ability to read and understand it. He will also give us the ability to share it with others in the way we understand it.

FADE OUT:

INT: BRANDON'S BEDROOM-EARLY MORNING

CUT TO:

Fred is waking up Brandon to go hunting.

FRED

Wake up Brandon we need to try and trap some game to put up for the winter. Be quiet so we don't wake up your mother.

BRANDON

Okay.

Fred and Brandon slip out of the house as quietly as possible and they are carrying an oil lamp to light their way.

FADE OUT:

EXT: IN THE WOODS-MORNING

CUT TO:

As the morning breaks they now have traveled two or three miles into the woods looking for signs of a deer trail or evidence of wide hogs.

FRED

Look here son.

Fred points toward the ground.

FRED (CONTINUES)

This is a deer's trail and over there looks like a hog or maybe some turkeys have been digging around, rooting. This may be a good place to watch.

A couple of hours have passed and the only things they see are a few squirrels and some birds. Fred whispers softy to Brandon.

FRED

I was hoping we'd get at least two deer today and maybe a hog too. It would help our winter food supply. But it doesn't look like we going to get them today. We'll have to try somewhere else in a few days.

Fred picks up his rifle and their supplies and heads back in the direction they came from.

FRED

Come on son let's head home.

Brandon hurries to pickup his things.

BRANDON

Okay dad.

FADE OUT:

EXT: FREDS FRONT YARD- MORNING

CUT TO:

The Eaton's home place is almost completely cleared for farming. Their house too is almost finished. Their house is two stories with the bedrooms upstairs. Mary is standing with Fred handing him a bag.

MARY

Here is some bread and dried meat for your lunch today. How long do you think you'll be at the Macalister's?

FRED

More than likely all day, we'll need to cut at least 10 trees for the base of his home.

Fred is leaving for the Macalister's home, Joe John's brother meet them to help cut timber.

The three men are cutting down a very large oak. Joe has climbs the tree to tie a rope on the top of the tree. After Joe climbs down he pulls the rope to a nearby tree and raps

the rope around the tree in such a way to pull tension on the rope while John begins to chop the tree with his ax. Fred looks at the tree when he hears a loud cracking sound from the tree as it begins to twist in John's direction. Fred runs toward John.

FRED

John; Watch out!

There is an even louder crack from the tree and it begins to fall, Fred runs and knocks John out of the way, only to get pinned himself. The two men worked diligently to free Fred from under the tree. When they finally get him out from under the tree they can see Fred is hurt seriously.

JOE

John; please go get Mary and then get the doctor from the fort.

John takes off running in the direction of Fred's house.

FADE OUT:

EXT: THE EDGE OF FREDS FIELD-RAINY AFTERNOON CUT TO:

There is a hole that is dug in the ground. All of Fred and Mary's neighbors are slowly walking away from the hole. Two men are left that begin to shovel dirt back into the hole. Mary and Brandon continue standing by the grave long after the men have finished filling the hole and have left.

FADE OUT:

INT: INSIDE MARY'S HOME-MORNING CUT TO:

A month and a half has passed since Fred went to be with the Lord and Mary kneels beside her bed as she does every morning.

MARY

Lord God my heavenly Father; I
thank you everything you have
given Brandon and myself and I
also thank you for the things you
do for us every day. I know in my
heart you will take care of all
our needs and you have a plan even
though I can't see what it maybe.
I'm trusting in your Love for us,
so I'm praying that your will be
done. In Jesus Amen

FADE OUT:

INT: IN MARY'S KITCHEN-NOON

CUT TO:

Mary and Brandon are in the kitchen going through their winter supplies. Mary looks out the window toward the wood pile outside.

MARY

Brandon; can you bring in some more wood, please?

BRANDON

Yes mother.

We really need more wood cropped before the winter snows. It needs time to dry.

MARY

I know your right about the wood but do you think you can handle your dad's ax?

BRANDON

I don't know but I want to try.
I'll be careful.

MARY

Okay; but please do be careful.

Brandon takes the ax outside with him as he goes to the wood pile. He sets up a small piece of wood on the chopping block and swings the big ax hitting the small piece of wood. It takes him a few hits to break the first piece but he continues working on the wood pile one piece at a time for a couple hours. Mary keeps watching him through the window not letting him see her. Brandon takes off his small coat that he is wearing and in no time he is sweating. Brandon beings to cough a little but he keeps on splitting the wood. After some time his cough is getting worse finally to the point his mother yells for him to come in.

MARY

Brandon I think that's enough wood for now, please come in to rest a while.

Brandon has the ax in one hand and picks up his coat with the other hand. He sits the ax next to the door as he comes in and then takes a sit at the table while his mother gives him a glass of water because Brandon is still coughing.

MARY (CONTINUES)

I believe you're getting too hot out there and you don't want to get to hot in this cool fall air. I think maybe you should go lie down for a little while. I'll bring something to help with that cough, maybe some honey. I've

always heard honey will make your throat feel better when you have a cough.

Brandon goes upstairs to his bedroom.

FADE OUT:

INT: MOLLY'S LIVING ROOM-NOON

CUT TO:

FRANK

This is a good stopping place now someone else gets to finish the story.

MOLLY

Yes okay let's take a short break to get another piece of pie and everyone something to drink.

All the kids jump up to run to the kitchen. Molly and Susan follow the kids into the kitchen. Mabel turns to Mike and speaks to him.

MABEL

Mike I believe you know the story well enough to finish for us.

MIKE

I don't know granny. I've never being good at speaking in front of people, I might mess it up.

MABEL

These are not just people they are family so don't worry about messing up. I believe you'll do just fine. You're a man and should

be able to give to your kid's part of their inheritance. This story is not just some fairy tell but it's a part of our family's legacy and history. It tells what God did for this family and it also tells who we are and where we come from.

MIKE

Since you put it that way, what choice do I have?

Molly, Susan and the kids all come back into the living room. They have their hands full with drinks and goodies. Everybody gets back into their sits.

MABEL

Okay Mike has agreed to finish the story for us.

Everyone gives a small yell.

EVERYONE

Ya!

MIKE

It's early as Keme steps out of his tee-pee.

FADE OUT:

EXT: OUTSIDE OF KEME'S TEE-PEE-MORNING CUT TO:

MIKE'S VOICE

Keme is looking around when two squirrels catch his eye.

VOICE FADE OUT:

It's a rainy day as Keme steps out from his tee-pee and is looking around and two squirrels come inside his supply tee-pee. They are running back toward the woods with their jaws full of nuts and they have nuts in their paws too. He runs toward them picking up rocks as he goes, throwing the rocks at them. The squirrels run fast up a nearby tree, shaking their tails at him when they get on a high limb. Keme walks back to the tee-pee only to find two more squirrels accompanied with some chipmunks coming out of the tee-pee running in every direction. He steps inside the tee-pee to find more chipmunks loading their jaws not just with nuts but with grain that he has stored up. Keme steps back outside and watches in amazement as the squirrels, chipmunks and even the birds are moving in the same direction all with nuts and grain. The chipmunks are scarring across the ground and the squirrels are jumping from limb to limb. Keme walks slowly in the same direction that the animals are moving. He moves farer into the forest watching the animals and birds. He follows the animals until he comes into a clearing at the edge of the Eaton's place. Keme stays in the tree line for several hours, watching the animals take the nuts into a small hole beside the chimney, in the side of the log cabin. Keme moves to a large tree that is beside the home. He climbs the tree just high enough now he can see inside Brandon's. Brandon is lying on his bed covered up and he is asleep. He coughs from time to time even while he is asleep. Mary is sitting on the edge of his bed and she is placing a wet rag on his forehead. Keme can see her lips moving but he can't hear what she is saying. He climbs higher up the tree where the hole beside the chimney is. Keme leans out from the limb he is on to look into the hole; this causes him to twist around the limb breaking a small limb making a cracking sound. He is hanging upside down looking now through the window again. The sound causes Mary to turns toward the window she is looking at him and he sees her. This causes him to lose his grip and fall. He hit his head on one of the limbs on the way down. This knocks him out and then he hits the ground with a very loud thud. Mary runs to the window and looks at Keme who is flat on his back on the ground, not moving. Mary gets her gun then she goes outside where Keme is lying on the wet ground. Keme doesn't move even after Mary nudges him with the gun, Mary realizes he is knocked out cold. It start to rain harder again and she finally drag's him into the house, putting him next to the fireplace. She ties his hands and then she bandages his head to stop the bleeding. He doesn't regain conciseness for several hours but when he does it's only for a moment and then he's back out again.

FADE OUT:

INT: MARY'S KITCHEN- MORNING

CUT TO:

The next morning Keme wakes up and tries getting up but he falls back onto his bed and Mary motions him to stop.

MARY

I don't know if you can understand but you hit your head really hard when you fell out of that tree.

Now Keme motions for Mary to stop.

KEME

I do understand.

There is a surprised look on Mary's face.

MARY

Where did you learn English?

KEME

When I was on a boat headed for England, after I was taken captive. My name is Keme. I was taken prisoner to be a slave for King George or to sell on the market. But when I meet The king,

he was so impressed with my ability to speak English he made me an interrupter between our peoples.

MARY

You do seem to understand our language very well. Maybe you shouldn't have any problem explaining why you were in that tree looking through my windows?

KEME

I didn't mean to frighten you. I wasn't climbing the tree to look through your windows but when I tell you why I was in that tree you will think I'm crazy.

MARY

Let me decide what I think, but for now I want to know why you were up that tree.

KEME

I was following some squirrels that had stolen some nuts from me. They had gotten into my winter storage. I followed those rescales from my camp all the way through the woods until they finally lead me here to your house. Then I sawed them taking the nuts into a small hole that is in the side of your house.

Mary moves away from him a bit and then gives him a strange look.

MARY

You're right about what I would think; I think you may be a little crazy. You must have hit your head too hard. I know if something like that was going on here I believe I would have noticed.

PAUSE

MARY (CONTINUES)

You can stay today only because you're not able to travel but tomorrow I believe you'll be well enough to go.

KEME

Please let me show you that I'm telling you the truth.

Keme tries again to get up but falls back again.

MARY

You can show me later maybe but for now you need to stay lying down.

Mary has a bowl of stew she start to hand to Keme then she realizes his hands are still tied so she begins feeding him herself but before she does she bows her head and closes her eyes.

MARY

Lord thank you for this food. Amen.

Mary looks back up at Keme and then offers him some stew with the spoon.

MARY

Here this should help you to feel a little better.

Keme takes the food and after he eats he falls asleep.

FADE OUT:

INT: THE LIVING ROOM OF MARY-MORNING

CUT TO:

The next morning Keme wakes up to the sound of pans rattling. Mary is dressed in men's pants she has altered some of Fred's old cloths. Mary is taking down a pan that the handle is gone and places it next to the fireplace. She leans down to stirs up the coals in the fireplace. Keme looks at the small pile of wood by the fireplace.

KEME

If you untie me I will get you some more wood, you can trust me I mean you no harm.

MARY

I'm sorry I shouldn't have left you untied up last night. After our talk I knew even though you may be a little crazy you're harmless.

Mary walks over to untie him.

MARY

Do you think you're able to carry wood?

KEME

Yes; I can.

Keme gets up slowly and he finally makes his way outside. He brings in several pieces of wood placing them in the pile next to the fireplace. When Keme comes back into the house the second time Brandon's cough echoes through the house. Mary and Keme both stop what they are doing and look in the direction of his room.

KEME

How long has the boy been couching?

MARY

For several days now; I plan to take him to settlement to see the doctor tomorrow, if he's doesn't get any better. Well if my old horse can make the trip.

Then there is another sound of something small running across the loft rails above their heads. Keme points up toward the ceiling.

KEME

Hear that? That's what I was telling you about. Is there a way I can get into the ceiling of this house?

MARY

There is one way but it's through my bed room. I don't think it's appropriate that you should go into my bed room.

KEME

Please trust me I must know what they are doing up there. I'll just take a quick look if you'll allow me.

MARY

I must be crazy too.

Mary leads Keme up the stairs and into her room. She point to the small trap door in the corner of the room. Keme moves the small table that is next to the bed and places it just under the place in the ceiling. There is still the sound of animals running through the ceiling. Keme pushes up on the small door trying to open it but he can hardly move it at first. Then with one big push the door fly's open and hundreds of nuts mixed with grain begin to fall on his head almost knocking him off the table. The look on his face was one of pain. The nuts knocked the bandage off his head and Mary began to laugh a little, she can see he is in pain so she tries to control her laughter.

MARY

I apologize. Are you alright? That must have hurt?

KEME

It did but I'm okay.

After the nuts finally stop falling Keme put his head up into the attic after a minute he steps down from the table. He picked up some of the nuts off the floor and hands a few of them to Mary.

KEME

These nuts here do not grow anywhere around here. They come from the south area about two days from here. Take some these and give them to your son they should help him with that cough and these nuts here you can make a delicious cake that will also help him regain his strength to get better.

Then Keme reaches into a small pouch on his side and gives Mary a piece of root.

KEME (CONTINUES)

Put a pinch of this into some water twice a day, one in the morning and one in the evening this too will help the boy to get over that cough.

MARY

How do you know about these things? Are you a doctor for your people?

KEME

No; my father was. He taught me a few things when I was young; you know how to help people.

Keme moves toward the door of the room.

Mary has two hands full of nuts and then she offers them to ${\sf Keme.}$

MARY

Don't you want some of these nuts back? They were yours?

KEME

I don't need them I still have enough so you can keep them.

KEME (CONTINUES)

I've seen many strange things in my life but I've never seen animals do something like this before. One of the God's must be smiling down on you.

MARY

We believe that there is one true God, Jehovah the God of Israel.

There is a noise at the door of Mary's room it's Brandon. He has his rifle in hand pointing it toward the ground in Keme's direction.

BRANDON

Mother is everything alright? Who is this?

MARY

This is Keme one of our neighbors. Everything is okay you can put that away.

Brandon is barely able to stand so he leans the rifle against the wall.

BRANDON

What is he doing here?

MARY

It appears that there have being some squirrels stealing his supplies and bringing them to us.

Brandon has a puzzled look on his face.

MARY (CONTINUES)

It appears God has sent us a winter supply of nuts and grain more than enough to last the winter. The animals have made our attic their place of storage. I believe there is enough that we'll be able to make bread and cakes to trade them at the settlement getting the other supplies we need.

FADE OUT:

INT: MOLLY'S LIVING ROOM-AFTERNOON CUT TO:

MIKE

Keme came back all during that winter bring them wood, deer meat and he even brought a turkey or two. As Brandon got better Keme took him to hunt and showed him many Indian ways of tracking. Mary taught Keme how to read from the bible and she also taught him about Jesus. He gave his life to Christ in the spring of the next year. Mary's heart turned toward the next summer and they were married. They had three children of their own other than Brandon. Keme continued interrupting for the American Indians and the English settlers. The End.

MABEL

Mike You did a wonderful job. I haven't heard that story told that well since my grandfather told it when I was a young girl. Oh that brings back such memories.

MINDY

Wait! Whatever happened to Brandon?

FRANK

He went on to be one of the first evangelists to the American Indians.

DAVID

What about the other three kids they had? What happened to them?

MABEL

One was your great, great, great grandmother Isabel. The two boys were married and moved their families out west.

The boy's get up from their sits and one grabs the football.

DANNY

Mom; can we go out and play now?

JUNE

Yes, you can go out now.

Molly, June and Susan pick up the bowls of nut shells and take them into the kitchen. Matt is now talking with Mabel but you cannot hear what they are saying. Mike and Frank begin to talk between themselves as well.

FRANK

You did a wonderful job with that story. I didn't realize you knew it so well.

MIKE

I do remember you and mom telling us the story and how I loved hearing it, it never got old for me.

FRANK

MIKE

I knew you were right when you told me to focus on the kids and try to not let it affect them. With me not being there it's impossible for them not to question why.

FRANK

Can I give you a little more advice?

MIKE

Sure.

FRANK

Give it to God. I know that's easier said than done. He can mend anything we go through. We've being praying and we'll continue to as long as it takes. We can pray now, if you like?

MIKE

Yes, I believe I would like that very much.

FRANK

Father you are the God in the midst of heaven above; we also know you are the God in the midst of our hearts. I ask you to bind together Mike's faith and my own for Cathy and his marriage. We ask that you please work your love into this matter and bring their

marriage back together again. In Jesus Christ name Amen.

MIKE

Amen. Thank you dad; I love you.

FRANK

I love you too.

The men hug and then they walk into the kitchen and as they come into the room the phone rings and Molly answers.

MOLLY

Hello; well hey Cathy this is a surprise. How are you?

PAUSE

MOLLY (CONTINUES)

We really miss you too. Yes Mike is here hold on for a minute, okay?

Molly holds her hand over the phone.

MOLLY

Its Cathy do you want to talk with her?

MIKE

Yes. I think it's time.

Mike takes the phone and walks toward the door.

MIKE (CONTINUES)

Hello.

PAUSE

MIKE (CONTINUES)

I've been making it. How about you?

Mike walks out the back door and he is still on the phone. Frank watches as Mike goes out the door. The shuts behind Mike and Frank looks down at Mindy.

FRANK

What did you think about the story?

MINDY

It had a lot of sad parts but I'm so glad it had a happy ending.

FRANK

It should remind us that we have so much to be thankful for; our past, present and our future. When we are thankful only good things happen. When we give thanks from our hearts God see that. Faith in our lives shows itself through the praise and thanksgiving we give.
